DIRECTIONS to Takai Tree Farm---17824 Thompson Creek Road at Newman Lake:

Coming from the Spokane Valley or Idaho: Turn north off Trent Ave (Route 290 in WA or Route 53 in ID) at the Newman Lake turnoff onto Starr Rd. Go 3.5 mi to Hauser Lk Rd. Turn right (east) & go 1/2 mi. to Muzzy Rd. Turn left (north) on Muzzy & go 3-4 mi. to Thompson Creek Rd. Turn right (north) & go 1 mi. Turn into barnyard on right side (look for huge red house/barn) & follow road around red house across meadow.

Coming from the north side of Spokane: Take Mt. Spokane Park Dr (Route 206) to Forker Rd. or take Bigelow Gulch Rd to Forker Rd. Turn south on Forker if from Mt. Spokane Park Drive or north on Forker if from Bigelow Gulch until Foothills. Turn east on Foothills & follow until Foothill ends at stop sign at intersection with West Newman Lake Dr. Turn left (north) on W. Newman Lk. Dr. & go 2-3 miles to Thompson Creek Rd. Turn left (north) & go 1 mi. Turn into barnyard on right side (look for huge red house/barn) & follow road around red house across meadow.
